







The Senior Mobility Problem

Our aging society




Few viable mobility options

Your Biggest Issues: Summary

- Loss of safe driving ability related to declining functional abilities (e.g., vision, cognition, flexibility, etc.) or age-related illness (e.g., stroke, Parkinson's, dementia, etc.)
- Better fitness to drive evaluation (e.g., lower stress, easier to administer, self-administration, more well-informed physicians, etc.)
 - Resistance by some to self-restriction

Availability and accessibility of **public & alternative transportation options and resources**

- especially in rural areas
- Loss of independence → loss of pride/sense of self when having to rely on others for mobility or feelings of isolation
- Poor community design
 - Pedestrian accessibility & safety
- Novel Vehicle Technologies (e.g., crash avoidance, info-tainment, etc.)
 - Availability of adaptive tools & technologies to make vehicles more seniorfriendly
