Tips for spotting human trafficking



What is Human Trafficking?

- Human trafficking is a global crime in which people are coerced, bought, and sold for forced labor or commercial sex.
- Human trafficking is happening in all 50 states and does not discriminate by race, gender, or social status.

What Should I Look For?

- Human trafficking often doesn't look the way it's portrayed in movies or on TV. Look for atypical or unsettling behaviors that lead to a feeling that something is off.
 - Does the person appear scared, anxious or afraid to speak or make eye contact?
 - Does the person appear to be under the influence of a substance?
 - Are there signs of physical or mental abuse, neglect, or self-harm?
 - If a seemingly parent and child, does the relationship appear "normal" with a clean, healthy, appropriately dressed child?
 - Are there multiple individuals under the control of one person?
